# 2. Utilizing game cameras for wild hog activity






#### **TRAPPING & WILD HOG BEHAVIOR**

## 3. Best trap placement techniques

 near hog activity, blends with natural environment, near water source, flat surface, pre-baiting

4. Understanding wild hog behavior - prefer areas with water, dense vegetation, highly developed sense of smell, trap shy, dangerous



# 6. Trap door /chute set up/trailer



# 7. Dispensing captured wild hogs

- Dispatch at trap site
  - Dispose carcass in a safe location
  - Consumed for personal use with proper food safety practices
