## 3. Best trap placement techniques

- near hog activity, blends with natural environment, near water source, flat surface, pre-baiting



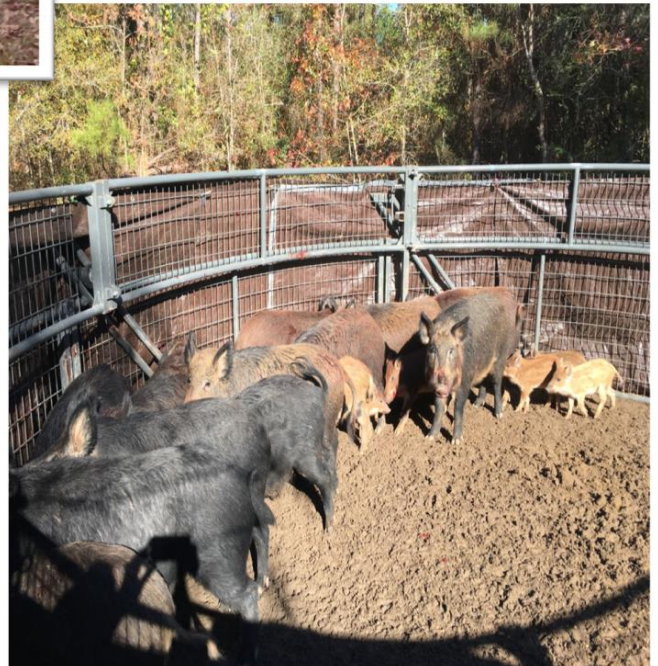
# TRAPPING & WILD HOG BEHAVIOR

4. Understanding wild hog behavior -  
prefer areas with water, dense  
vegetation, highly developed sense of  
smell, trap shy, dangerous

## 7. Dispensing captured wild hogs

- Dispatch at trap site
  - Dispose carcass in a safe location
  - Consumed for personal use with proper food safety practices
